



The very first step to starting a journal is simple.


All you need is an empty notebook and your favorite pen.


Journals can serve as powerful trackers by using their flexible layout to record and visualise data, from daily habits and mood to study goals and project progress

To start a gratitude log, simply write the date and then what you are grateful for on that day.












EMDROIDERY PROJECT
