Do not send your child to school if they are displaying these symptoms. Book a PCR test if symptoms of Covid appear.


School Action Group

Year 6 have been playing Diembe Drums. It has caused much hilarity as we have been using shower caps to cover the drums to keep them Covid safe!!






Year 8 have been working on their keyboard skills playing a simple 12 bar Blues chord pattern and improvising over the top.








Year 5 Work






GOOD JOB

8. No shouting, nagging, complaining etc.



In English, Year 7 have been writing letters to Lady Macbeth from Macbeth. They have been learning how to write in italic and making their papers look old.




Year 7 have also been producing their own versions of Macbeth's soliloquy about whether to kill the king.

They have even used Scratch to make a Macbeth game!








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Year 8 have been reading Holes and have been doing a variety of work including essays, new book covers, Madam Zeroni stories and advertising new inventions.


